**Inc 322** 12/10/17 Ettington Close Wellesbourne  
Graffiti has been reported on a fence in this location. Local team are patrolling the area and recording details to progress enquiries.

## Vehicle Crime Prevention

Officers will be handing out security packs to victims of car crime and people who live in car crime 'hot spot' areas.

The packs, which have been funded by Warwickshire Police and Warwickshire County Council, contain car security advice; wipes to remove any trace of sat nav use in the car and tamper proof screws for number plates.

They also contain other useful items such as ice scrapers and air fresheners.

Sgt Simon Ryan states: "These packs are part of a series of proactive measures we are putting in place to tackle the rise in car crime in the county as well as in identified hot spot areas and we are actively identifying suspects for crimes committed.

"While we are doing a lot of work to tackle car crime in the county it is still important that local people take precautions to protect their vehicles.
